

Welcome to Sign Language Week

We're thrilled to have your business join our celebration of Deaf community pride, identity and language.

Sign Language Week is the **British Deaf Association's** national celebration of British Sign Language (BSL) and Irish Sign Language (ISL), held every March. It marks 18 March 2003, when BSL was first recognised by the UK Government, and encourages people across the country to learn about — and connect with — the UK's signing communities.

The British Deaf Association (BDA) is the **national Deaf-led organisation representing BSL and ISL across the UK**. Founded in 1890 by Deaf leaders, we exist to strengthen signing communities, support families, celebrate Deaf culture and identity, and lead national change towards sign language equity.

This year's theme, **United in Sign**, invites everyone to show pride and allyship by celebrating the languages, culture and identity of the Deaf community.

Sign Language Week 2026 will take place from **16–22 March**, and we're asking you to turn your business blue for the day in support of Sign Languages and the Deaf community

Wear blue, decorate in blue, and raise a funds **in support of Deaf-led change** for BSL, ISL and Deaf culture.

Your involvement helps build a future where **Deaf children grow up proud and connected**, and sign language is **embedded and respected** across public life.

Wear it Blue – How to take part

Choose a day during Sign Language Week and turn your business blue — showing pride, allyship, and support for Deaf-led change across the UK.

Why blue?

Blue is a key colour in the Deaf flag, a global symbol of Deaf identity and unity.

The flag's turquoise blue represents sign language and community — the heart of Deaf culture. The dark blue represents humanity, and the journey of Deafhood.

Why it matters

- Celebrates sign language and Deaf culture within your community
- Supports Deaf-led programmes, youth leadership, family support and our work leading the UK towards a future where sign language belongs everywhere.






